PEGGE HOPPER

Pegge Hopper was born in Oakland, California and later received her higher art education at the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, California. Pegge's first job was to design murals for department stores for Raymond Loewy Associates in New York. Then Pegge traveled in Europe. She worked in Milan, Italy for 2 years where she worked for La Rinascente, designing posters and graphics.

In 1963 Pegge moved to Hawaii and worked as an art director for an advertising agency. In 1970, Pegge began a "Paintings of Island Women", exhibit that was displayed in Hawaii as well as in Chicago, Los Angeles and Seattle. She has permanent collections of her art work at the Hawaii State Foundation on Culture and the Arts, The Honolulu Advertiser and Contemporary Arts Center in Hawaii, the Bishop Museum, the Honolulu International Airport and the Pacific Club.

The Pegge Hopper Gallery is located at 1164 Nuuanu Avenue, Hon. HI. Pegge Hopper's art gallery features original paintings, drawings, posters and limited editions of her work.

ROY VENTERS

Roy Venters has an art gallery in Chinatown at 1160 Nuuanu Ave., Hon., HI. Roy specializes in custom designed hearts made of multicolored glass. Most of these one-of-a-kind hearts are approximately 7 X 7 X 3 inches in size and costs about \$500.00 each. Venters started his art exhibits three decades ago at his one-man show at the Contemporary Museum, in the mid-1970s. The unique and whimsical artwork of Roy Venters includes his one-of-a-kind decorated and painted furniture at his Nuuanu Ave Art Gallery. Now in his 50s, Venters is a Hawaii Pacific University Art Gallery Board Member.
